

Can a Coordinator Assist with a "Thank-You Luncheon" Subsequent to the Original Occasion?

If the post-event meal is a small, casual affair with the same group of people, your planner might be able to handle it as an add-on of your primary package at a lower price.

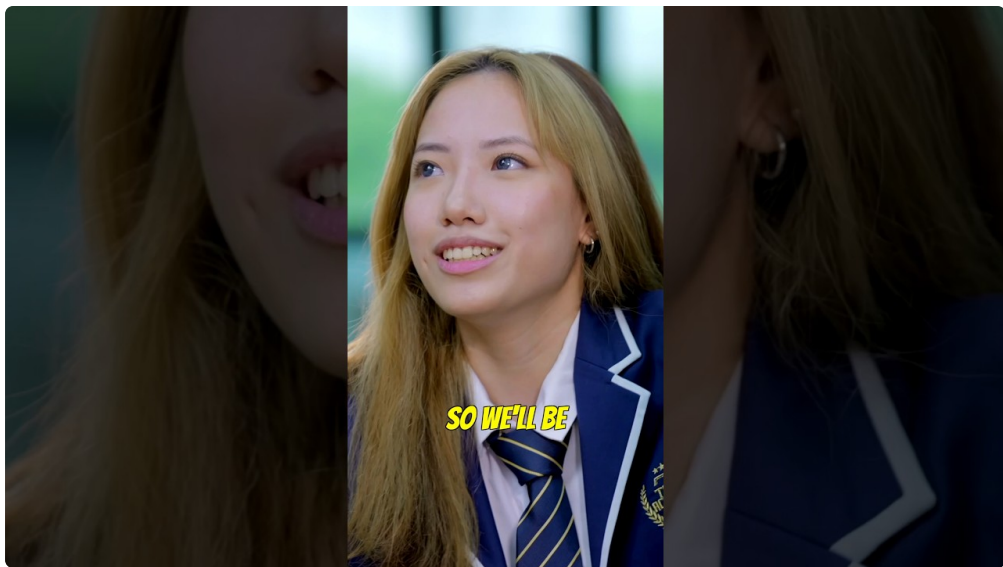


Ways a Professional Can Support with a Follow-Up Meal

A coordinator can help with pretty much every detail of a secondary event just as they would the primary event.

This covers finding and booking the venue, working with food providers or eateries, coordinating attendees and confirmations, creating the right visual tone for a midday, low-key affair, and overseeing the event flow when the gathering happens.

They can furthermore take care of the arrangements of transitioning from the first celebration to the second if the events are on distinct days or if they're happening on the same day.



Budget Implications

The price of including a thank-you luncheon to your specialist's responsibilities will be influenced by the scope of work involved.
