The question that nags is obvious and blunt: may George Washington determine in the present day's America—or suppose we deserted every little thing he fought for? Did Thomas Jefferson think of freedom might at some point feel debatable? Are we honoring the vision of the Founding Fathers—or rewriting it to in shape today's politics? If the Constitution have been written right this moment, would it even continue to exist public opinion? Have we grew to become the concept of liberty into some thing the Founders could withstand?
