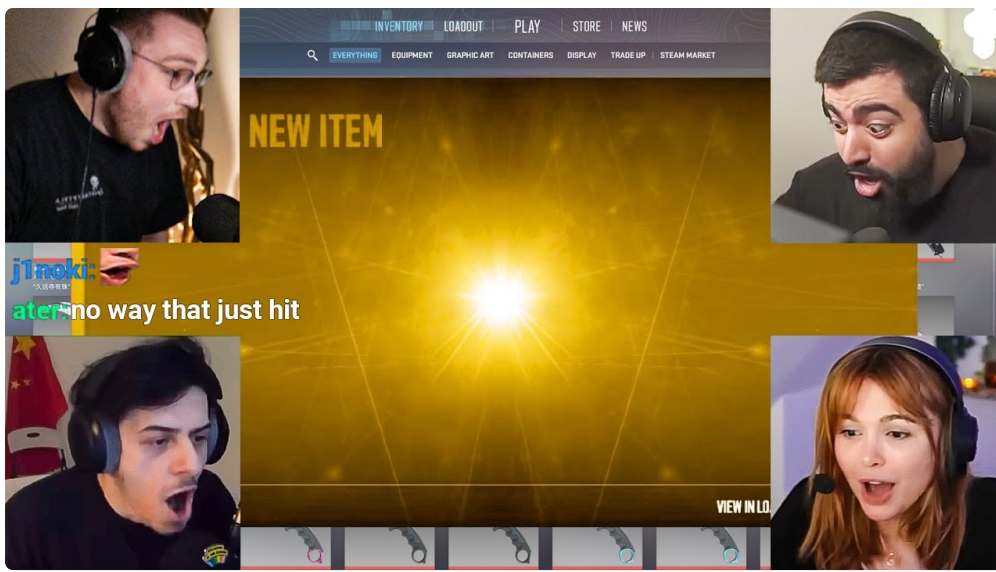
2. Pick Cases Wisely
