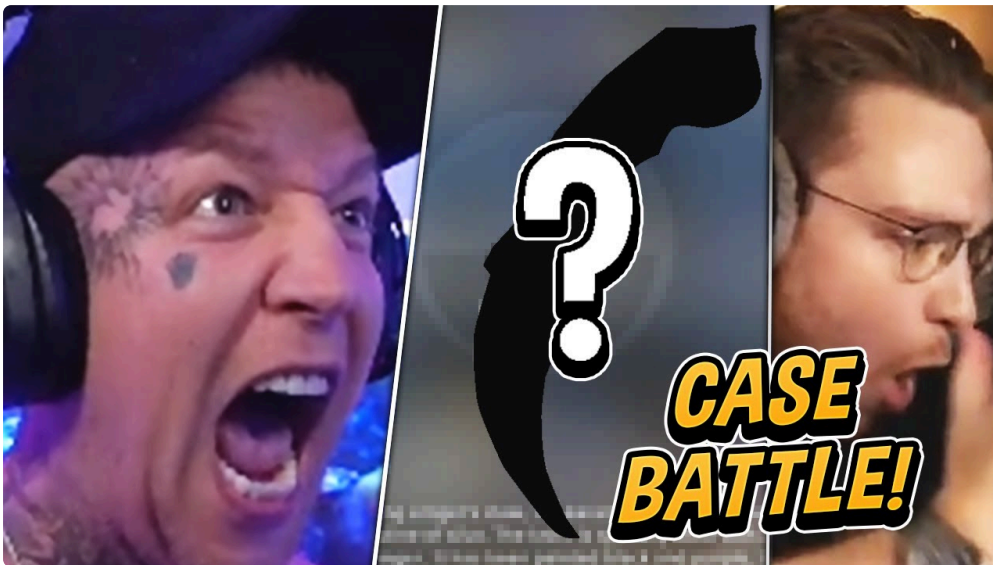
## Example Cost Structure

To show the economics of a normal 10-person battle, consider a lobby that utilizes the "Gamma 2" case ( $\approx$  £ 2.30 per case). Each individual purchases one case, so the total pot is £ 23.00. The platform takes a 5% commission (£ 1.15), leaving £ 21.85 to be dispersed as follows:

In practice, payments differ widely due to the fact that the skins dropped can be worth anywhere from a few cents to several hundred dollars.



## Top 5 Tips for Beginners

1. **Start Small**-- Choose low-cost cases (e.g., CS: GO Weapon Case, Operation Bravo) to familiarise yourself with the circulation without running the risk of big bankrolls.
2. **Understand the Drop Tables**-- Each case has a recognized probability circulation. Understanding which skins are "unusual" assists set reasonable expectations.
