An uncomplicated 1v1 game mode. Two gamers wager skins of roughly equal value. The system assigns one player "Terrorist" and the other "Counter-Terrorist," flips a virtual coin, and the winner takes the whole pot (minus a small site commission, understood as the rake).

4. Prize

Several players toss skins into a common pot. The worth of each gamer's skins determines their portion possibility of winning the whole pool. A virtual spinner chooses the winner, meaning a gamer who transferred a low-value skin still has an opportunity-- albeit a little one-- to win whatever.
