

A windshield never seems to break at a polite time.

It happens on I-40 when a dump truck spits a stone into your lane. It happens in a parking lot after a hot afternoon and a cool evening turn a small chip into a wandering crack. It happens before a school pickup, before a job interview, before a weekend drive toward the mountains. One second the road is clear, the next you hear that sharp snap against the glass and your eyes dart to the damage.

That little burst of adrenaline is real. A damaged windshield changes how you drive, how safe the cabin feels, and how quickly your day can spiral. The good news is that a sudden glass problem does not have to become a full-blown expedition into chaos. The first minute after the glass breaks

5. What warranty or workmanship support comes with the service?
