2. **Track the Return to Player (RTP):** Different bets in *Crazy Time* have differing RTP percentages. For example, betting on number 1 generally uses an RTP of around 96.08%, while the Crazy Time bonus sits around 94.41%. Use the demo stage to weigh risk versus benefit.

3. **Take Notice Of Chat and Host Interaction:** While not mathematically relevant, observing how the live host engages and how the community responds in the live chat helps immerse you in the genuine game program environment.
4. **Develop a Hypothetical Bankroll:** Even while seeing the demonstration, keep a psychological tally of how you would wager. If you began with £ 100 and placed £ 10 bets per round, for how long would your funds last? This assists develop accountable bankroll management habits.
