The CS2 Economy: Active vs. Rare Drop Pools

The CS2 economy is completely driven by supply and need. Valve categorizes cases into 2 unique pools, which drastically impacts their price and potential roi.

1. The Active Drop Pool

These are cases currently dropping to gamers actively playing the game. Due to the fact that supply is continuously increasing, these cases are generally extremely inexpensive (often under £ 0.10 GBP).



- *Examples:* Kilowatt Case, Recoil Case, Dreams & Nightmares Case.

2. The Rare (Discontinued) Drop Pool

When Valve presents a new case, older cases are pushed into the "Rare Drop Pool." They rarely drop after matches any longer, indicating their supply is strictly finite. As gamers open them, the overall number in presence reduces, causing their prices to escalate.

- *Examples:* CS: GO Weapon Case, Operation Bravo Case, Huntsman Weapon Case.

Methods for Interacting with CS2 Cases

Players usually approach CS2 cases in one of 3 ways. Choosing the right method depends on individual monetary objectives and run the risk of tolerance.

- **The Collector/ Investor:**

 - *Method:* Buy secrets and open cases for the adrenaline rush of potentially hitting an unusual knife.
 - *Objective:* Entertainment, accepting that the anticipated monetary worth is negative.
