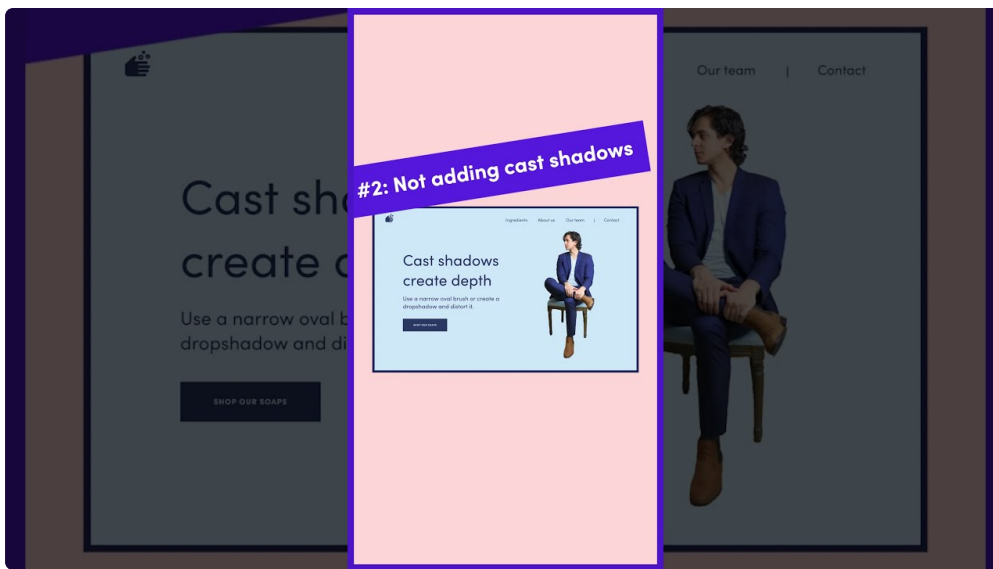

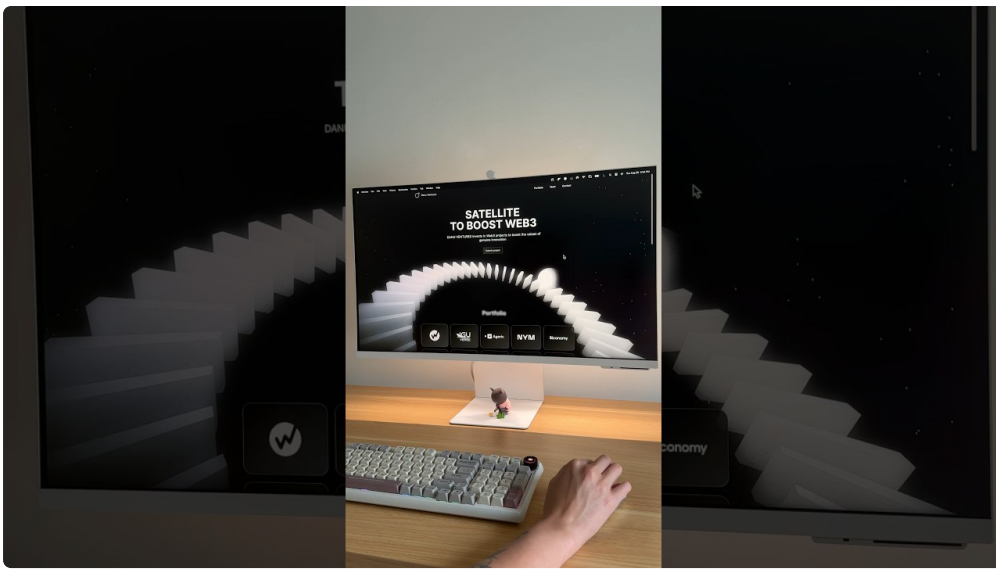
Case reports from practice

A group overall healthiness nonprofit asked me to simplify their web site after donor proceedings approximately difficult navigation. We reduced height-point nav presents from 9 to 4, consolidated useful resource pages right into a single "Resources" hub, and standardized button patterns. Donations rose through 14 p.c inside the first month after launch. The prices have been modest due to the fact we reused current content material and centred on pruning in place of developing new sources.

On the other hand, a luxury watchmaker that desired a "minimal" ecommerce site needed to shelter the tactile sense of the product. Instead of cutting off visual richness, we decreased interface muddle although holding big, prime-selection product photography and sophisticated motion to express aspect.
