- **API Throttling and Bans:** Valve routinely targets and prohibits bot accounts linked to commercial gambling websites.
- **Stop and Desist Letters:** Major networks have actually gotten legal pressure from Valve to close down operations in particular jurisdictions.

In spite of these measures, the ecosystem continues to adapt, with new platforms finding alternative ways to facilitate peer-to-peer (P2P) trading and crypto integration.

Best Practices for Navigating the Space
