

For many Orlando homes and apartments, a smart lock is less about novelty and more about cleaner daily access. Why keypad entry feels different

Why door prep matters

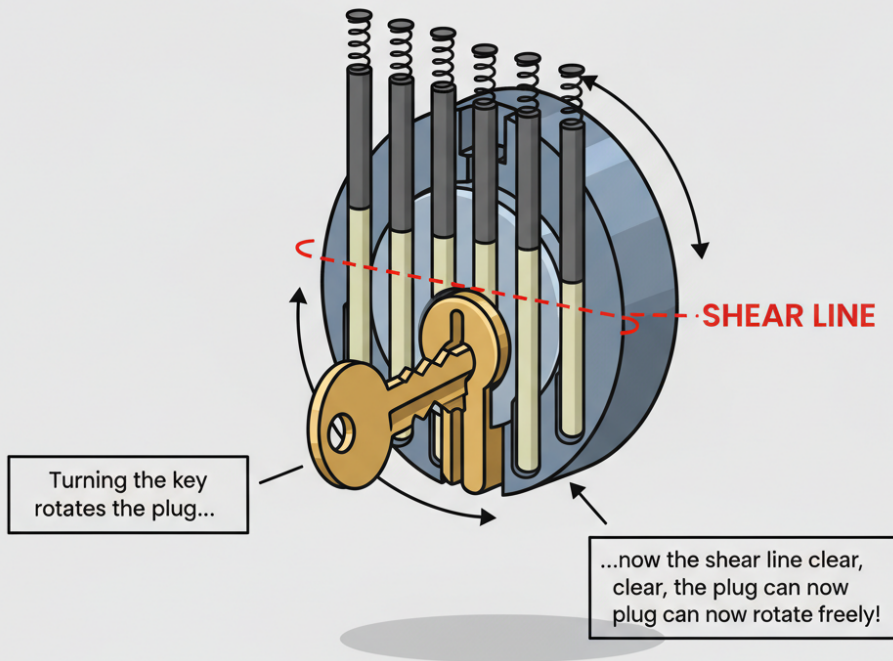
