- **The Martingale System:** A timeless betting strategy where a player doubles their bet after every loss. - **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, attempting to ride a winning streak while keeping losses lessened to the base bet quantity.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing little bets with the intent of claiming huge multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This functions similar to playing the lottery game.
