For example, a two-prong outlet installation performed without grounding certification, or an oversized breaker installed without load calculations, can trigger denial language. When sudden and accidental damage occurs downstream—a fire, shock hazard, or equipment failure—the insurer investigates the installation history and discovers the unlicensed or non-compliant work, then denies the claim citing the pre-existing violation.
