The Mathematics of Opening CS2 Cases

- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** 79.923%
- **Restricted (Purple):** 15.985%
- **Classified (Pink):** 3.2%
- **Covert (Red):** 0.64%
- **Rare Special Item (Knives/ Gloves):** 0.26%

To put that into point of view, the odds of unboxing a rare knife or pair of gloves are roughly **1 in 385**. Because of these steep chances, the mathematical expected value (EV) of opening a case is generally lower than the cost of the key and the case combined.
