- **Hidden Owners:** Legit sites are generally proud of their brand and transparent about their business backing. Scam websites conceal behind anonymous domains and unverified shell business.
- **Inability to Withdraw:** If a website requires you to transfer *more* cash just to unlock your profits (typically framed as a "tax" or "verification fee"), it is a fraud.

Tips for Safe CS: GO Gambling

For those who select to take part in skin gambling, practicing smart bankroll management and digital hygiene is necessary:
