2. **Use Condition (Float Value):** Every skin has a floating-point worth between 0.00 and 1.00 that identifies its physical wear and tear.
3. **StatTrak™ Technology:** Weapons with this function track the number of validated kills a gamer makes with that specific item, generally marked by a little digital counter on the weapon.
4. **Pattern Templates:** Some skins include dynamic patterns. Depending on the "paint seed," various parts of the texture appear on the weapon, which can considerably modify its desirability.

### Understanding Wear Conditions and Float Values

When players get a skin, its condition is appointed among five official wear tiers. The physical look modifications substantially across these classifications, typically exposing scratches, fading colors, or tainted metal.

Use Tier Float Value Range Visual Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Pristine condition with very little to no visible wear. Often the most pricey variation of a skin. **Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Small blemishes or minor scratches, typically just visible upon close examination. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Moderate wear. Scratches and paint cracking become plainly visible on the body and barrel. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45

Considerable wear. Significant parts of the paint are faded, and heavy scratches are prominent. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Incredibly worn. The weapon frequently looks greatly rusted, unclean, or practically totally removed of paint. *(Note: Some skins look distinctively cool in this condition, earning the nickname "Blackimov").*

## The CS2 Economy: Cases, Keys, and the Marketplace

The community surrounding CS2 skins runs much like a real-world stock market. Valve introduces brand-new weapon collections by means of cases, which drop randomly to players during matches. To open a case, gamers must buy a virtual key.

Since the contents of a case are randomized, opening them is a kind of gambling. The vast majority of opened cases yield lower-tier, affordable skins. The unusual opportunity of unboxing an unusual knife or concealed rifle drives the opening craze.

### Methods of Acquiring Skins
