CoinFlip is a direct player-vs-player (PvP) game mode. 2 players wager skins of approximately equivalent financial value. A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes the whole pot, minus a little commission (house edge) taken by the site.



4. Jackpot

In a Jackpot game, several players throw skins into a main pot. Each skin contributes to the player's total portion opportunity of winning the entire pot (based upon the dollar value of their contribution). A virtual spinner selects a winning ticket, and one lucky gamer takes home all the deposited skins.
