Electromechanical Transition and Bigger Payouts

- Bonus games and free spins triggered by special symbol sets

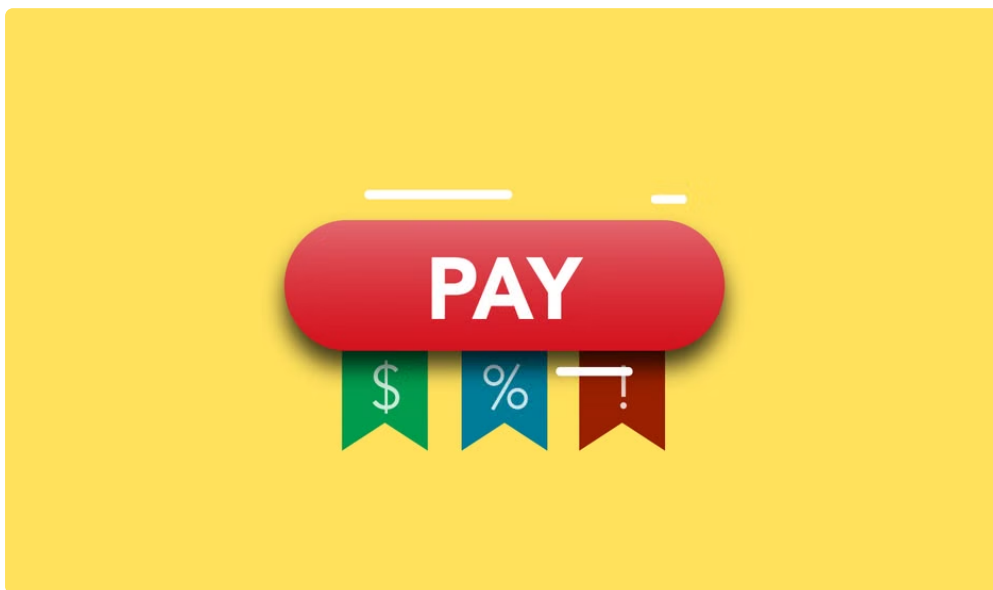
