4. Jackpot

In a Jackpot video game, multiple gamers throw skins into a central pot. Each skin contributes to the gamer's total portion opportunity of winning the whole pot (based on the dollar value of their contribution). A virtual spinner chooses a winning ticket, and one lucky player takes home all the deposited skins.
