Even with fewer guests, I recommend having at least two spots to promote flow and prevent clustering at one location. Labeling each station clearly helps guests know where to find or drop used napkins without searching or crowding.

## Small Plates Placement and Reducing Snack Table Crowding

Napkins work hand-in-hand with thoughtfully placed small plates—you want guests grabbing both quickly without creating bottlenecks.

My tips for effortless small plates setup include:

- **Separate small plates from napkins:** Have a separate, clearly labeled station or tray for small plates away from napkins. This means guests can pick up plates and then move naturally toward snacks and then napkins, instead of forming a queue all in one spot.
- **Offer finger foods where possible:** According to guidelines by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), finger foods reduce the risk of spills and mess, making napkins easier to manage.
- **Use trays and bins labeled with printable signs:** This minimizes searching time and keeps your setup understandable at a glance.

When snacks don't require forks or drool-prone sauce-dipping, guests naturally move faster and feel less awkward fumbling for napkins mid-game.

## Incorporating Digital Invitations and Printable Signs for Cohesion
