2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a basic Case Hardened AK-47 is fairly cost effective, the top-tier pattern indices-- specifically Pattern 661-- cover practically the entire leading receiver of the gun in a beautiful, reflective blue.
