1. Steam Community Market (SCM)

- **Pros:** Direct integration with the game; keys are immediately delivered to your stock.
- **Cons:** Prices are set by the neighborhood and may be higher throughout high-demand durations.

2. Authorized Third-Party Retailers

- **Pros:** Often provide discounted rates, bulk packages, and occasional promotions.
- **Cons:** You need to validate the website's legitimacy; some resellers run gray-market schemes.

3. In-Game Store (for choose cases)

- **Pros:** Simple deal using Steam Wallet funds.
- **Cons:** Limited choice; not all case secrets are offered for direct purchase.
