The Regulatory and Legal Landscape

The intersection of video games, underage gambling, and unregulated financial markets has drawn considerable attention from federal governments, regulative bodies, and Valve itself.

Valve's Crackdown

In 2016, Valve issued formal cease-and-desist letters to dozens of significant skin gambling sites, mentioning that these platforms were breaking the Steam Subscriber Agreement by utilizing OpenID and business APIs for business gambling functions. Ever since, the community has actually existed in a continuous cat-and-mouse game: sites frequently change their domain, embrace cryptocurrency options, and adjust their integration techniques to stay functional.

Legal Considerations
