

Hollyville sits in that part of Sussex County where the landscape still tells on itself. You notice it in the mix of older farm properties, modest homes that have been added to over time, roadside vegetation that seems to know the rhythms of the coast, and the way a few miles can change the texture of a neighborhood. The area is not polished in the slick, suburban sense, and that is part of its appeal. It has a working feel, a lived-in quality, and a steady connection to the broader Millsboro region. That same character is what makes exterior care feel especially important here. Buildings in and around Hollyville do not just face ordinary weather.
