Note: The designers actively patch skins that cross the line into unjust territory, sometimes changing textures to eliminate severe advantages.

- **The Ailen Artifact SMG:** Featuring a streamlined, futuristic style, this skin is coveted for its clean look and relative deficiency.

- **Big Grin Metal Facemask:** An intimidating, horror-inspired mask that has become a sign of wealth and high-skill PvP players in *Rust*.
