Notes:

- The "Covert" rarity is the rarest tier and constantly looks like the bonus item (knife or gloves).
- The percentages revealed are approximate and can shift slightly with each case patch.
- Rates on the Steam Market frequently go beyond the in-game expense for extremely sought-after skins.

3. Why These Cases Matter

3.1 Economy Influence

When a brand-new case launches, the marketplace responds within hours. The **Recoil Case**, for instance, drove the rate of the *SCAR-20|Plan* (Mil-Spec) from £ 0.15 to £ 0.45 on the first day. Conversely, older cases like **Prisma** typically see a cost dip as supply stabilises.

3.2 Aesthetic Variety
