This approach turns AI disagreement from a liability into a transparent, documented part of the consulting process that strengthens client trust.

Verification and Evidence Handling

Keeping evidence attached to a consultant write-up is non-negotiable. Without visible references or linked source material, AI-generated content risks becoming unsupported opinion or worse, misinformation.
