3. The Unboxer (Proceed with Caution)

- **The Play:** Buy keys and open every new case that drops.
- **Why:** Pure entertainment. Mathematically, opening cases is akin to playing a lottery game with a greatly manipulated house edge. While hitting a rare knife or hidden skin yields a huge dopamine hit (and financial return), the huge bulk of openings result in low-tier, low-value weapon finishes.
