- **The Martingale System:** A classic betting technique where a gamer doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recover all previous losses plus a revenue equivalent to the initial base bet. However, this needs a massive bankroll and can quickly strike site betting limitations.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* rather than a loss, attempting to ride a winning streak while keeping losses reduced to the base bet amount.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing small bets with the intent of claiming massive multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This works just like playing the lottery game.
