- **Jackpot:** Multiple players deposit skins into a common pot. A winner is drawn randomly, with higher-value deposits increasing a player's analytical opportunity of winning the entire pot.

While both involve wagering, CS2 gambling varies significantly from standard online gambling in regards to currency, availability, and community integration.
