As seen in the table above, the number sectors appear a lot more regularly than the bonus rounds, using smaller, more consistent payouts. The puck bounces down arbitrarily up until it settles at the bottom into a slot marked with a multiplier (or a "Double" sector, which doubles all multipliers on the board and triggers another drop).
- **4. Crazy Time:** The holy grail of the game. The host opens a red door causing a surreal, virtual world including a huge giant wheel. Players need to pick among 3 flappers (Green, Blue, or Yellow). The wheel spins, and whichever multiplier the chosen flapper indicate is granted. If it arrive at "Double" or "Triple," all multipliers on the wheel boost, and the wheel spins again as much as an optimum of 20,000 x.
