The Risks and Controversies

- **Account Bans:** Users caught utilizing their Steam stocks for commercial gambling operations risk having their individual Steam accounts permanently banned, leading to the loss of their whole video game and skin libraries.

Regardless of these efforts, the need stays so high that new platforms constantly emerge to replace those that close down.
