If a player receives a skin in a trade, they can not trade it again for a complete week. This seriously disrupted the automated, high-frequency trading bots used by CSGO gambling establishments.
- **Account Bans:** Valve regularly prohibits accounts associated with business gambling, resulting in countless dollars worth of skins being locked completely inside banned stocks.
