- **Enable Steam Guard Mobile Authenticator:** This is non-negotiable. Without it, trading and offering on the marketplace are greatly limited, and accounts are vulnerable to hackers.
- **Check Third-Party Site Reputations:** Before entering payment details or logging into a third-party website, research community sentiment on platforms like Reddit (r/GlobalOffensiveTrade) or Trustpilot.
- **Beware of API Scams:** Never log into a website that looks similar to Steam unless the URL is explicitly steamcommunity.com or steampowered.com. Scammers frequently utilize fake login pages to steal API secrets and pirate trades.
- **Verify Trade URLs:** Ensure that the trade URL utilized on third-party websites belongs to the right account and hasn't been intercepted by malware.

To Open or Not to Open?

Purchasing cases is just half the battle. To in fact open a case, players must purchase a **Key** (costing roughly £ 2.50 GBP in-game).



Mathematically speaking, opening cases is a losing monetary proposition. Valve programs the drop rates so that the huge bulk of openings lead to consumer-grade (blue) weapon skins worth significantly less than the rate of the secret.

- **Blue Skins (Mil-Spec):** ~ 79.98% possibility

- **Purple Skins (Restricted):** ~ 15.98% chance
- **Pink Skins (Classified):** ~ 3.2% opportunity
- **Red Skins (Covert):** ~ 0.64% chance
- **Special Rare Item (Knives/Gloves):** ~ 0.26% chance

Keep in mind: Percentages are approximations based upon community tracking and data collection.

Best Practices for Unboxing

1. **Set a Budget:** Treat case opening like entertainment (like going to a casino), not as a financial investment technique.
2. **Purchase the Skin Directly:** If a player specifically wants a Neon Rider or an AWP Asiimov, it is often more affordable to buy the skin outright from the marketplace rather than attempting to unbox it.
3. **Deal With Cases as Investments:** Many gamers prefer to purchase discontinued cases, hold them in their stock, and sell them later as their rarity drives the price up.
