6. Set Stop-Loss and Take-Profit Limits

- Define a loss ceiling (e.g., 20% of your session bankroll) and a revenue target (e.g., 50% increase). Walk away when either limitation is hit to prevent "tilt" decisions.

7. Utilize "Insurance" with Cheaper Cases

- After a high-risk battle, balance the session by going into a low-cost battle utilizing a cheaper case. The smaller sized, steadier wins can offset the difference of the earlier high-risk rounds.

Turning cases can diversify difference. However, consistent switching may hinder your ability to track market patterns for specific skins. How essential is timing when entering a battle?

Market demand varies with CS: GO updates, tournament events, and seasonal trends. Getting in battles when popular skins are at a premium can increase the value of prospective wins. Alternatively, going into during a market slump might decrease the profitability of high-tier drops.
