

What Does Home Depot's \$99 Garage Door Opener Installation Cover?

Garage door rollers can become loud or seize as bearings wear. Replacing worn rollers may restore smooth operation and reduce stress on the opener. A garage door cable can fray, unwind, or come off its drum. Frayed lift cables should not be handled casually because the door may shift or fall during repair.
