- **Jackpot:** Multiple players pool their skins into a single pot. The higher the worth of a gamer's skin relative to the overall pot, the greater their percentage possibility of winning the whole swimming pool.
- **Case Opening:** Simulated variations of Valve's in-game case openings, typically including customized odds and higher-tier benefit swimming pools developed by the site operators.

Comparing Types of CS: GO Gambling Platforms

Not all platforms run the same way. The industry typically categorizes sites into 3 distinct designs based on how they manage deals.
