

Car Wrecks Along NW Military Highway and Castle Hills Not every life-changing crash happens on a freeway. Plenty of them happen on the roads you use for ordinary errands, like NW Military Highway through Castle Hills, Blanco Road near Churchill Estates, or the streets that lead to Phil Hardberger Park and Wurzbach Parkway. These are neighborhood routes with shops, schools, churches and driveways, and that constant stop and start creates its own kind of risk. A driver pulls out of a parking lot without looking. Someone turns left across traffic because they think they can make it. A car ahead brakes for a turn signal nobody saw coming. These crashes often happen at lower speeds than a highway wreck, but lower speed doesn't mean minor injury. Whiplash, back injuries and concussions are common, and the pain sometimes shows up a day or two later. Insurers know this, and they sometimes argue that a "low impact" crash couldn't have hurt you. Seeing a doctor quickly and following through on treatment gives your claim a clear medical record to stand on. Fault can get murky on these streets, too. Texas uses modified comparative fault, also called proportionate responsibility. If the other side claims you were partly to blame for a lane change or a turn, your recovery goes down by your share of fault, and if you're found 51 percent or more at fault, you can't recover at all. Photos, witness names and the Texas Peace Officer's Crash Report, known as the CR-3, can help settle who did what. SAPD usually responds to crashes in this part of town, and the report can be requested through TxDOT's CRIS system.

San Antonio Car Accident Lawyer How much do lawyers take from a car accident settlement in Texas? Most Texas car accident lawyers work on contingency, so their fee is a percentage of what they recover and nothing if they lose. Check everyone for injuries, call 911 and get the report number from SAPD or the Bexar County Sheriff's Office. Take photos of the vehicles and the scene, get witness details and see a doctor quickly, even if you feel fine. Then call The Aguirre Law Firm, PLLC at (210) 922-0808, which is open 24 hours a day. Can I recover compensation if I was partially at fault? Yes, in many cases. Texas uses modified comparative fault, so you can still recover as long as you are less than 51 percent responsible, although your award is reduced by your share of the blame. Insurers often push extra fault onto injured drivers after crashes at busy spots like Loop 1604 and I-

10, and the firm works to challenge that with evidence. Should I talk to the other driver's insurance company? It's best not to give a recorded statement before you get legal advice. Adjusters can use casual comments like "I'm fine" to argue your injuries aren't serious. Alex Aguirre knows these tactics from his years on the defense side, and his team can handle insurer calls for you from the first day. How long do I have to file a car accident claim in Texas? Texas generally gives you two years from the date of the crash to file a personal injury lawsuit, and two years from the date of death for a wrongful death claim. Some claims, such as those involving a government vehicle, can have earlier notice requirements. Calling The Aguirre Law Firm, PLLC early gives the team time to gather evidence before it disappears. What compensation can I get after a San Antonio car wreck? You may be able to recover current and future medical costs, lost wages and earning capacity, property damage, pain and suffering, mental anguish and physical impairment. In cases of gross negligence, such as some drunk driving crashes, Texas law may also allow exemplary damages. The firm reviews every category so nothing gets left out of your claim. What if the driver who hit me has no insurance? Your own policy may still protect you. Texas insurers must offer uninsured and underinsured motorist coverage and personal injury protection, and PIP is included unless you rejected it in writing.
