- **In-Game Drops**-- Participate in the initial operation or event where the case was readily available. Some cases still drop periodically during "replay" objectives, though the likelihood remains tiny.
- **Marketplaces**-- Platforms such as the Steam Community Market, Buff.163, or third-party skin websites (e.g., CSGOStash) list uncommon cases. Always validate the seller's credibility and usage escrow services.

2. **Store Properly**-- Keep cases in the Steam inventory instead of withdrawing to external wallets to avoid fraud.
3. **Monitor Market Trends**-- Use price-tracking tools like CSGOStash, SteamAnalyst, or Buff.163 to enjoy cost movements. Seasonal spikes often take place throughout major tournaments or video game updates.
4. **Diversify Portfolio**-- Don't position all capital in a single case. Spread investments throughout several uncommon cases to alleviate risk.
