4. Update

A mechanic special to skin gambling websites.



- **How it works:** A gamer selects a skin from their stock that they want to trade up, selects a target skin of greater value, and spins a wheel. The wheel's success zone shrinks or grows depending upon the mathematical distinction in between the 2 items' values.
