Understanding Your Login Intent: Branded vs Discovery

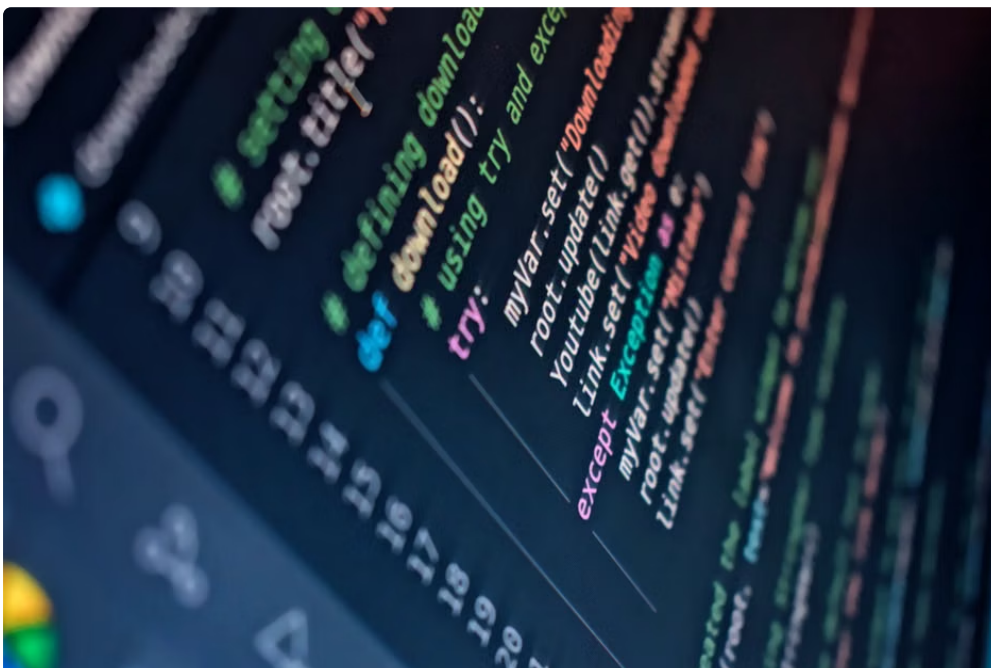
Before you even touch the keyboard or mouse, it's important to clarify what your intent really is. Online flows often blur the line between *discovery intent* — when you're searching for information or games you might like — and *branded login intent* — when you specifically mean to access your BingoPlus account.

- **Discovery Intent:** Searching for games, promotions, rules, or general info about BingoPlus.
- **Branded Login Intent:** You want to go directly to your account to play, check your balance, or manage settings.

This distinction matters because clicking on search results or links that appear to mention Bingoplus might lead you to a *guidance page* or promotional content rather than the actual login screen. Always keep your goal in mind.

Read the Hostname Out Loud Before Typing Anything

A golden rule we always advise: **read the website's domain out loud aloud before entering any information.** For example, when you see bingoplus.com, say "Bingo Plus dot com" clearly to yourself. This helps your brain confirm that you are on the official site and not a cleverly disguised phishing page.



Phishing sites often try to mimic genuine sites by using similar spellings or subdomains. Saying the hostname can help you catch suspicious differences like:

- `bingoplus-login.com` instead of `bingoplus.com`
- `bing0plus.com` (zero instead of letter O)
- `bingoplus.com.login.confirm.ru` (which is not BingoPlus but a subdomain on a foreign domain)

Always check the URL bar carefully, especially on public computers where malware might tamper with links.

Don't Confuse Guidance Pages with the Actual Login Screen

Many users make the mistake of entering their credentials on a page that looks like part of BingoPlus but is actually a *guidance page* or a page that explains how to get started — not the secure login portal itself.

The **BingoPlus login screen** is specifically the page where you enter your username and password (and any one-time codes). It is designed for authentication and will usually be secured with HTTPS and show a padlock icon in the browser.

How to Spot a Guidance Page or App Download Page Instead

- The page invites you to *download the BingoPlus app* but does not have input fields for username/password.
- It includes instructions on how to play or promotional material about games.
- There is no lock icon or the HTTPS is missing/invalid.
- URL contains words like `/guidance`, `/download`, or `/how-to-play` rather than `/login`.

For example, if you land on a page that looks like a download or promotional site rather than the direct login, close it and navigate only to `bingoplus.com` play login page.

Why App Download Pages Are Not the Same as Login

BingoPlus offers an easy way to play directly in the browser or via their dedicated app. But their **app download page** differs from the login screen:

Never attempt to enter your login info on app download pages. Instead, if you want to play immediately on a public PC, use the browser-based BingoPlus web login page.

Account Recovery Is a Separate Process, Not Part of Navigation

One common source of confusion is mixing the "navigation" task — getting to the login page — with "account recovery" — regaining access if you forgot your password or username.

Here's what you need to know:

- **Navigation:** Simply getting to the authentic login screen.

- **Account Recovery:** Initiated once you are on the login page, through a clearly labeled "Forgot Password?" or "Recover Account" link.

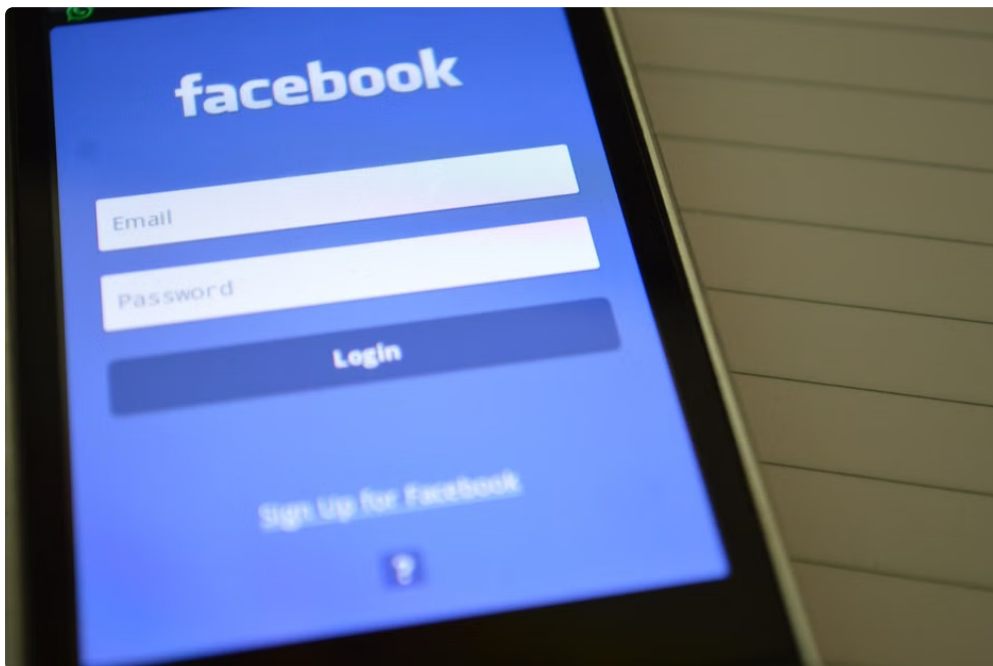
Do not enter any recovery information, one-time codes, or passwords on any website that isn't the genuine Bingoplus login screen. Support channels will never request you to send your password or codes via chat or email — anything asking you to do that is a red flag.

Top Tips for Using Public Computers for Bingoplus Login

1. **Check Destination First:** Always verify the URL reads bingoplus.com aloud before typing anything.
2. **Use Official URLs Only:** Bookmark or manually type bingoplus.com/play/pwa/login/ to avoid phishing links.
3. **Avoid Saving Info on Public Devices:** Never check "Remember Me" or save passwords.
4. **Keep One-Time Codes Private:** If BingoPlus uses two-factor authentication, enter codes discreetly and never share them with others.
5. **Log Out Completely:** Once done, log out and close the browser window to clear session data.
6. **Use Private/Incognito Mode:** This avoids leaving cached login data behind.
