

What to Anticipate for a Trip Budget in Oswego

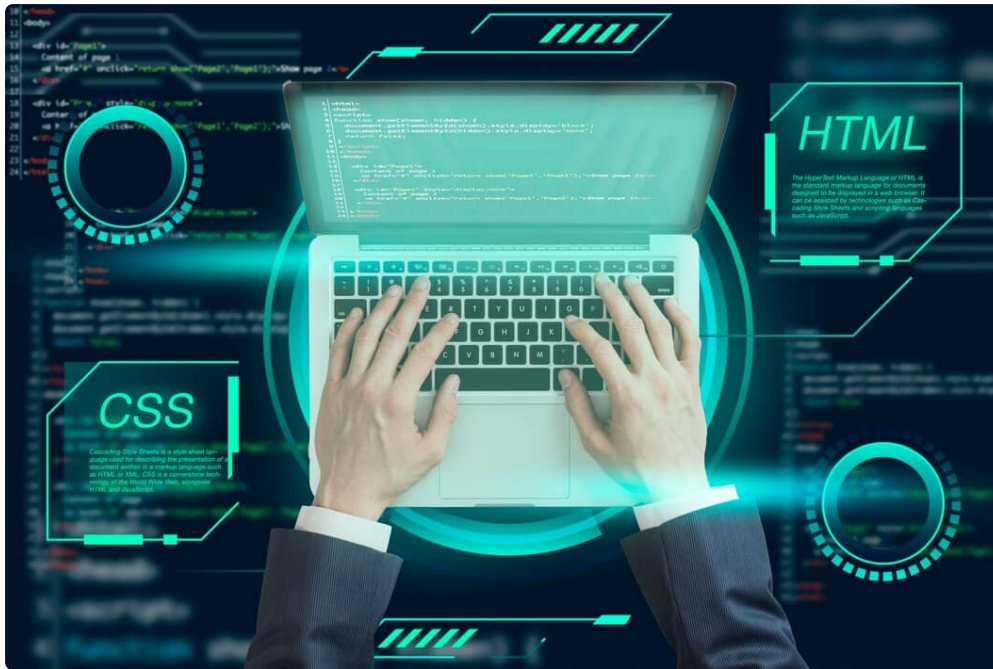
Accommodation Expenses in and Around Oswego
