

When an air conditioner quits in San Antonio, it rarely happens on a convenient afternoon. It tends to fail when the house is already warm, the sun has been beating on the roof all day, and everyone inside is trying to decide whether to open windows or just sit still and hope the temperature drops. What the first visit looks like

A lot of customers are nervous before a service call because they do not know what to expect. That uncertainty gets worse when the AC has failed and the house already feels uncomfortable. The process Proud Pops describes is built to reduce that stress. 4. If there is a noticeable sound, odor, or sudden change in performance, mention it clearly.
5. Gather any previous repair information you already have, if it is available.
