A "Provably Fair" system uses cryptography to show that the result of a case battle was predetermined and could not be modified by the site operator *after* you positioned your bet. You can validate the fairness of each round utilizing the offered server seeds and customer seeds.

5. Can I get VAC prohibited for using case battle sites?

Using third-party trading and case-opening websites does not straight lead to a Valve Anti-Cheat (VAC) ban. However, Valve periodically updates its regards to service or prohibits API keys related to automatic trading bots, which can briefly disrupt your ability to trade skins.
