

A broken garage door can quickly disrupt your regular activities, especially when the door will not open for work, school, or car access. Typical warning signs include a **garage door making noise**, grinding or squealing sounds, visible wobbling, and movement that pauses as the door travels. You may notice that the **door rises unevenly**, one side rises faster than the other, or the door appears to pull away from the track. A roller may also show cracked nylon, flattened edges, missing bearings, or excessive side-to-side movement.
