

Lula, Georgia, is the kind of town people often drive through without realizing how much is packed into it. From the road, it can look quiet, almost modest. Spend a little time here, though, and the place starts to show its rhythm. There are parks where families linger long after the ballgames end, roads that still feel tied to the shape of older North Georgia, and a local business culture that runs on handshakes, reputation, and doing work the right way the first time.

That same practical mindset shows up in an area people don't always think about when they're planning a day out in town: the roof over their heads. In Lula, weather is not a theoretical concern. A patch that does not integrate well can create visual and functional problems later.
