 - *Mixed Pair* (Different colors/suits): Typically pays 6:1
 - *Colored Pair* (Same color, various fits): Typically pays 12:1
 - *Perfect Pair* (Exact exact same fit and rank): Typically pays 25:1
2. **21 +3:** This side bet integrates the gamer's very first 2 cards with the dealership's upcard to form a three-card poker hand. Payments are structured as follows:
 - *Flush* (Same fit): 5:1
 - *Straight* (Sequential ranks): 10:1
 - *3 of a Kind* (Same rank): 30:1
 - *Straight Flush:* 40:1
 - *Matched Trips* (Identical three of a kind): 100:1
3. **Insurance:** Offered when the dealership's upcard is an Ace. Players can bet up to half their original bet that the dealership has a 10-value hole card (making a blackjack). If effective, it pays 2:1. *Mathematically, fundamental strategy advises against taking insurance over the long term, as the house edge on this particular bet is high.*

Distinct Payout Structures in Variant Live Games

The development of live casino software has actually given rise to innovative blackjack versions. These video games alter standard payments in exchange for distinct multipliers or dynamic gameplay mechanics.

Lightning Blackjack/ Quantum Blackjack

In these popular multiplier-based variants, players pay a small surcharge (usually a percentage of their main bet) to get in the video game. If the gamer wins a hand with a particular overall (e.g., 18, 19, 20, or 21), a randomly created multiplier between 2x and 25x is applied to the payment of the *next* winning hand.

Free Bet Blackjack

- **The Payout Twist:** Because the gambling establishment is identifying the gamer the cash for these useful relocations, a specific guideline is introduced to balance the house edge: if the dealership amounts to a difficult 22, all remaining player hands lead to a **Push** instead of a win (other than for a natural blackjack).
