

The first time I aided a neighbor set up a lawn sprinkler system, we reserved one weekend. We completed on the 3rd, sore, sunburned, and a little humbled. The system worked, although we spent the following month dialing in head placement, fixing tiny leakages, and learning why water pressure on paper does not always match what comes out of a trench line after eight tees and an increase in grade. That experience showed me a fact I have seen again and again: when it pertains to sprinkler installation, style decisions made on day one resemble for years, in water costs, in plant health and wellness, and in exactly how often you find on your own down in the dust doing lawn sprinkler repair.

This is not a scare item. A lot of home owners develop efficient, long lasting systems and take satisfaction in the results.
