3. Diversify Your Case Selection

Prevent dumping your whole budget into a single high-tier case like *Operation Bravo* or *Recoil*. Instead, mix low-tier, stable-return cases with a couple of high-variance cases to stabilize the danger.

4. Use "Crazy Mode" Cautiously

Crazy Mode (where the least expensive total value wins) flips **skin fights** basic reasoning on its head. While it can be enjoyable, it relies entirely on hitting low-cost, low-tier drops. Do not approach this mode with standard case-opening reasoning.
