2. **Check System Temperatures:** Overheating CPUs and GPUs will immediately throttle or close down procedures to prevent permanent hardware damage.

3. **Validate Recent Changes:** Did the crash start occurring immediately after a Windows upgrade, a graphics driver upgrade, or the installation of brand-new peripherals?

Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Solutions

1. Confirm Integrity of Game Files

- **Action 1:** Navigate to the game setup directory (generally C: \ Program Files (x86)\ Steam \ steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive).

- **Action 2:** Locate the primary executable file (csgo.exe).
- **Action 3:** Right-click the file and choose **Properties**.
- **Step 4:** Go to the **Compatibility** tab.
- **Step 5:** Check the box for **Disable fullscreen optimizations**.
- **Step 6:** Click *Apply* and *OK*.

Advanced Troubleshooting

If standard software fixes stop working to resolve the crashing problem, the problem might lie much deeper within the os or hardware configuration.

Handling Overclocks (CPU, GPU, and RAM)

Many competitive gamers overclock their hardware to eke out every last frame per second (FPS). However, source engines can be notoriously conscious unstable overclocks.

- If the system has an aggressive CPU or GPU overclock applied by means of MSI Afterburner or the BIOS, revert the clock speeds back to factory stock settings to check stability.
- **XMP/EXPO Profiles:** Unstable RAM profiles can trigger unexpected video game crashes and memory read mistakes. Try disabling XMP/DOCP in the BIOS temporarily to see if crashes persist.

Running as Administrator

Permissions issues can occasionally prevent the video game from writing required cache files to the storage drive.

- Find csgo.exe, right-click it, select **Properties**, go to the **Compatibility** tab, and inspect **Run this program as an administrator**.

Re-installing the Game

As a last option, a clean reinstallation makes sure that no residual conflicting files from old updates remain. Uninstall the game through Steam, by hand erase any remaining folders in the steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive directory, and download a fresh copy.
